HOW TO USE THIS CATECHISM:

- 1. Get in a group of 2 or more people
- 2. One person needs to be the designated teacher
- 3. The teacher needs to get hold of the 'Teacher's Guide'
- 4. Before meeting up with the group, the teacher, reads through the necessary questions in the 'Teacher's Guide.'
- 5. When meeting up, everyone tries to answer the questions
- 6. The Teacher explains what all the pictures mean




